




Christ Preaching at Capernaum

**MESSAGE FROM FR. JAIME AGUILA:** Mark 1:21-28: Jesus combats the power of evil. In the gospel of Mark, Jesus' first miracle is the expulsion of the demon. The people to whom Mark preached were devastated by the fear of demons and the action of impure spirits. The power of evil took root in them and alienated them from themselves.

There are many people who currently live lost in themselves because of the power of evil in the media, of commercial propaganda. The power of evil is confirmed by the denial of the human being. A denial that is rooted in the conscience of the individual and perhaps in their subconscious. This denial causes him to lose his essential humanity, transformed into an instrument, a machine dedicated to production of material goods that do not belong to him. People live as slaves to the project of evil, to consumerism, oppressed by the bills that must be paid on a certain date to creditors. Many think that they do not live as people worthy of respect if they do not buy what the propaganda advertises on television. A serious consequence of the power of evil in our times is the dehumanization or denial of the human being, in Mark's Gospel Jesus' first gesture is precisely that of throwing out and combating the power of evil.

JESUS RESTORES PEOPLE TO THEMSELVES. RESTORE THEIR CONSCIENCE AND THEIR FREEDOM. Jesus Christ gives us back our humanity.

## WHY DO WE FAST 1 HOUR BEFORE RECEIVING THE EUCHARIST?

The Eucharistic fast promotes a deeper reverence and respect for this Holy Sacrament.

The Code of Canon Law establishes in Canon 919: "Whoever is to receive the blessed Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from all food and drink, with the sole exception of water and medicine." This discipline does not apply to the sick and elderly.

St. John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord with fasting and penance, because fasting makes room in the heart, mind, body and soul for the Lord. We fast before Holy Communion for the same reason: to prepare the way for the Lord; to make room for Him; to "clean house."

**REFUNDABLE FUNDRAISER:** Our parish CWL has an ongoing fundraiser of collecting refundable products (Center main entrance). We thank you for your support and kindly remind you that **only refundable** items are accepted such as: rinsed plastic bottles, aluminum cans, drink boxes, milk containers. *Please do not drop off cardboard, soup cans or items that are not refundable to ensure our account is not suspended and remains in good standing.*

**REMINDER** to all Ministry Groups using our Parish Facilities. Please ensure all doors are properly closed & locked after use. Put all chairs, tables and other materials back as you found them ensuring to leave facility as you found it. Thank you for your support in keeping out Parish Centre and Church clean.


